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## Invitation to DARWIN Community of Practitioners (DCoP) Workshop

The DARWIN project would like to invite you to a 2,5-day interactive workshop, hosted by DARWIN partner KMC, in Linköping, Sweden from the 6th to the 8th of March. The cost of participation in the workshop (travel<sup>1</sup> and accommodation) is covered by the DARWIN project.

### Purpose of the DCoP workshop

The DARWIN Resilience Management Guidelines (DRMGs) consist of a set of principles, methods, practices and strategies to aid organizations in the creation, assessment or improvement of their own guidelines. Based on resilience management concepts, the guidelines help the organisation in developing a critical view of its own crisis management activities. They are intended to complement existing guidelines, procedures and practices already present in an organisation.

The DARWIN project will be finalized during the end of 2018 with the development of the DRMG and resilience concepts seen as essential by end-users named “Concept Cards”. The guidelines contain practical interventions associated to the concepts. These developments have always required an interaction and co-creation with stakeholders involved in crisis management at different levels, from policy to practice. Two previous Workshops have been performed with results and feedback from participating DCoP-members having a great impact on future work carried out within the project. The Concept Cards are now readily available on the DARWIN Wiki and the purpose of this third and final Workshop is to give all attending DCoP-members the opportunity of hands on experience integrating the DARWIN Concept Cards with their own knowledge. Furthermore the participating DCoP-members will take part in the rapid prototyping of two completely new Concept Cards.

### Scope of the workshop

The aim of the DRMG is to have a direct impact on the management of crisis. The workshop will focus on experiments with different solutions associated to the DRMG, training, rapid-prototyping of concept cards and evaluation. While co-creating the resilient virtual city of “Wedgewood” during the workshop the DCoP-members will be asked to reflect upon the usability of the Concept Cards within their own domain. Hence giving their critically important input in how each card can or could be used within their own domain and in cooperation with other domains. Together we will explore and cover everyday operations, expected and unexpected.

### Outcome of the workshop

The main outcomes of the workshop will be the participants’ critical view and enhancement on the operationalization and deployment of the resilience management in practice, inspired by the DRMG. Also the creation of two new Concept Cards through rapid prototyping will be trailed, assessed and evaluated. Finally, during the Workshop DCoP members will be given examples meaningful to each member showing how the DRMG can be adopted and adapted by them to their own actions and activities.

### Take away

Participants at this workshop will receive in-depth understanding and knowledge of the DARWIN DRMG and different forms of training associated to resilience management. Participants will also have the opportunity to make sure their priorities and needs are met when it comes to the future development of the DRMG. The workshop will facilitate exchange of knowledge, insights, expertise and lessons learnt for practitioners and researchers, and thus promote international networking concerning resilience aspects.
